STOP Human Trafficking: Working at Tereo is not for the faint hearted. Our staff are often subjected to the ugly realities of this world, and this was never truer than when STOP Human Trafficking came to our school on 7 June to present an education session for all staff to assist

them with seeing the signs of abuse and trauma and how to deal with the situation correctly. This was truly a rude awakening of what is going on in our suburbs and townships. Our biggest aim at Tereo is to protect and care for our learners so sessions like this are essential to equip our staff with the necessary skills.



The Floods... It was devastating to wake up on the 30 May and discover our school had been flooded, but what was even worse, we were flooded again on the 3, 8, 9 and 14 June with the water on the 14 June reaching depths of a meter within our school. But it is often in times of devastation that the value of friends, donors and supporters are seen with so many coming to the fore to help us.

As we had to evacuate the school, we were unsure where or how we would continue with teaching and completing the allimportant mid-year tests. Words cannot express how thankful we are to Imibala Trust who generously offered their premises for us to use until the end of term.
